Something different going on in the boardroom

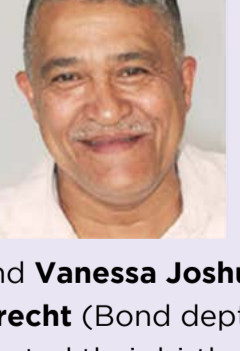
