Celebrating Youth Day

We at Pincus Matz along with all other South Africans will be celebrating Youth Day on 16 June 2014. Youth Day is celebrated in commemoration of the start of the Soweto Riots of 1976, sparked off by a government edict that all instruction in black schools would be delivered in Afrikaans.


The commemoration of this riot is not just to remember the people who fought for their rights to have schooling in their own language, but also serves to commemorate the role played by the youth in this country in bringing about equal rights for all youths and more importantly their role played in bringing about the Bill of Rights which is entrenched into our Constitution. The Bill of Rights sets out the fundamental rights of all South Africans, including the right to dignity and the right to equality. Sec 28 of the Bill of Rights deals specifically with the rights of all children.

Every child (child meaning a child under the age of eighteen years of age) has the right to;

- a name, and nationality from birth
- basic education
- basic nutrition, shelter, basic health care services and social services;
- to be protected from maltreatment, neglect, abuse or degradation
- receive education in the official language or languages of their choice in public educational institutions where that education is reasonably practicable.
- not to be required or permitted to perform work or provide services that are inappropriate for a person of that child's age; or place at risk the child's well-being, education, physical or mental health or spiritual, moral or social development;
- not to be detained except as a measure of last resort
- to have a legal practitioner assigned to the child by the state, and at state expense, in civil proceedings affecting the child, if substantial injustice would otherwise result.

The rights mentioned above are merely an indication of some of the rights which have been embedded in the Bill of Rights to protect our youth. It seems only fitting that we celebrate and remember the youths from years past and the struggles they endured. We celebrate our youth of today who will progress and become the world leaders of tomorrow.
